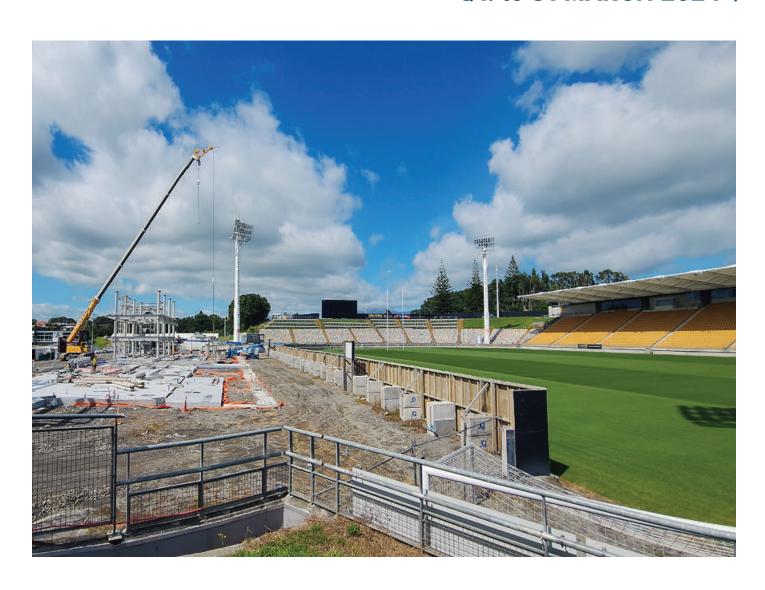

IRG PROGRAMME

OVERVIEW

IN APRIL 2020, IN THE MIDDLE OF NEW ZEALAND'S COVID-19 LOCKDOWN, THE GOVERNMENT TASKED A GROUP OF INDUSTRY LEADERS TO SEEK OUT INFRASTRUCTURE PROJECTS THAT WERE READY TO START AS SOON AS THE CONSTRUCTION INDUSTRY RETURNED TO NORMAL IN ORDER TO REDUCE THE ECONOMIC IMPACT OF THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC.

The Infrastructure Reference Group (IRG) was set up, consisting of highly experienced infrastructure leaders. The IRG steering group assessed and put forward to Ministers projects from the private and public sector which would have an immediate stimulatory effect on the construction industry, its workforce and the economy, and also included a mix of smaller projects that could demonstrate a direct and immediate benefit to the regional economies and communities in which they were based.

The IRG received submissions on 1,924 projects with a combined value of around \$136 billion over a wide-ranging number of project types. Projects needed to show that they could be underway within 12 months from the date of funding being contracted, with material employment benefits and which provided national or regional public benefit.

The submitted projects were considered against these criteria.

The IRG shovel ready announcement on 1 July 2020 identified 150 programmes/projects that were shortlisted to receive Government stimulus funding.

The IRG application process closed in late 2020, since July 2020 additional projects have been shortlisted. Projects have been announced progressively in principle and subject to due diligence. Once the appropriate due diligence was completed the projects were then formally approved by Ministers for the release of funding.

TE KUPENGA O RONGOMAI - MAIDSTONE SPORTS HUB

IRG Funding: \$15m

Total Project Spend: \$31.8m

TE KUPENGA O RONGOMAI IS AN INCREDIBLE SPORTING FACILITY FOR THE UPPER HUTT COMMUNITY AND SURROUNDING REGIONAL NEIGHBOURS.

Upper Hutt City Council has been developing Maidstone Park to create a regional 'destination' sport and recreation park. To achieve this a significant investment would be required to upgrade the existing tiring club facilities.

The project has its origins in a feasibility study and concept plan prepared in 2018 which involved significant consultation with various sporting clubs and codes. It was envisioned that a "sports hub" be built to accommodate all sporting codes currently situated at the park (plus consolidating some currently located elsewhere in the city); provide modern facilities in a central location with associated ancillary facilities such as improved access, parking, services, and both enhanced and additional public recreation and play spaces.

The building design boasted:

- 825sqm of indoor green space.
- 3 multi-function spaces each over 220sqm one space kitted out with a high performing sprung sports floor.
- Beautifully appointed club rooms upstairs with a kitchen and dividable function spaces.
- · Built in grandstand and toilet/changing facilities.

In addition to the main building the project also included:

- New sports field lighting to 300lux enabling semiprofessional matches to be played at night.
- Upgrades to the Pétanque facility.
- Additional bleachers and shelters for the existing hockey and football playing fields.
- New public toilets, car parking, and upgrades to the Upper Hutt softball clubs field diamonds.



Our new, cutting-edge facilities delivers a combination of spaces and expertise that strengthens Upper Hutt's appeal as a destination for hosting local and international events.





These additions are a major leap forward for the long-term plan of the park and a significant upgrade to what had been available previously. The whole community has been right behind the project including local schools, businesses, clubs, Orongomai Marae and NZCIS a private state of the art sports facility just down the road. The facility was blessed in February by Te Ati Awa and officially opened in March 2024 where a community open day was held to showcase the facility and wider park upgrades. A Mauri stone taken from the ground below the building was blessed and gifted back to council. It has been placed in the floor with a plaque for people to see as they enter. The Maidstone Sports Hub has also been gifted the name Te Kupenga o Rongomai by Te Ati Awa. The name makes a connection between Te Kupenga (a fishing net) and the hubs outreach into the community, akin to casting a net to bring people together.

The construction of the facility has supported and created many jobs and revenue for local businesses that have worked on the project. It has brought people and businesses together in a collaborative manner creating new business connections that has contributed to a stronger local economy.

Upper Hutt City council has created a CCO Te Kahu o Rongomai to run the facility. Since opening its doors to the public in March of this year the CCO has already held several functions and events from around the region including one national event. Te Kahu o Rongomai has developed a statement of intent strategy to implement and track the benefits, performance, and success of the clubs as a result of using the new modern facilities and equipment. We will be expecting to see an increase in membership attendance, better club financial health and Maidstone parks reputation reaching out and supporting other clubs and organisation's around the wider region.

Upper Hutt's population is under 50,000 people so to have a high performing sports facility of this nature is extremely fortunate, thanks to the support of key stakeholders, the project teams, and the Government funding of \$15M. It would also not have been possible to have nighttime games without further government funding of \$1M for the new field lights. The foundation sports who have been an integral part of the Maidstone Park whanau for many years and who have given up their existing facilities for this development include the Upper Hutt City Football Club, Upper Hutt Rams Rugby Football Club, Heretaunga Boxing Club and Upper Hutt Judo Club.

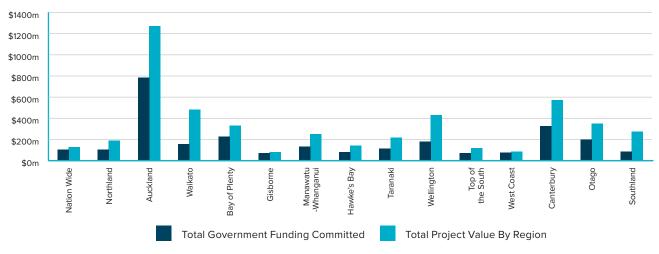

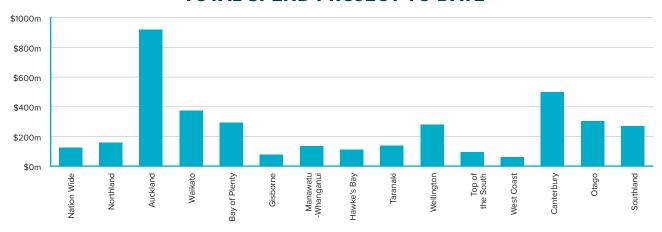

TOTAL GOVERNMENT FUNDING COMMITTED AND TOTAL PROJECT VALUE

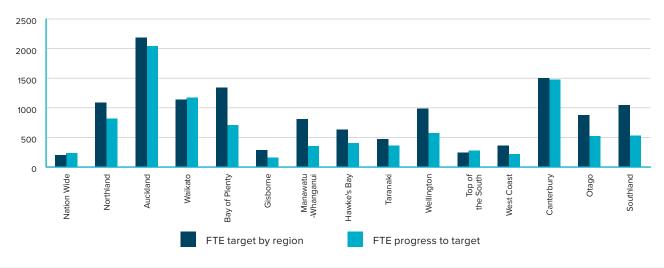

GLOSSARY

PROJECT DEFINITIONS:

Shortlisted: The project/programme was approved in principle by Government (subject to due diligence)

Approved: The project/programme was approved by IRG Ministers for funding release post-due diligence.

Funding Agreement: A legally binding funding agreement between the Government or relevant Crown Agency and the project owner.

Procurement: The total value procurement and supply contracts committed to by the project owner.

CONSTRUCTION STARTED:

The definition of 'construction started' is as follows:

- Contractor has taken possession of the site and hoardings/ site security fences are being erected,
- Site set out.
- Early enabling works, such as locating and moving of utilities.
- · Demolition of existing structures,
- Strip out of buildings interiors and/or asbestos removal,
- · Trenching for new utilities,
- Creation of temporary access routes to site,
- Earthworks.

FULL TIME EQUIVALENT (FTE):

- Projected FTE is the estimated number of workers that would be supported by that particular project, established during due diligence.
- Progress to Projected FTE is the equivalent number of full-time employees that were consistently employed over the main construction/redevelopment phase of the project. For example, in the early stages of a construction project the number of FTEs starts low, but the number of employees then rapidly increases when the main on-site construction phase starts, and off-site fabrication of key components commences. This is the appropriate number to compare against the project projected. Over time this figure will grow towards the projected. Key criteria for project selection was to support construction sector employment.
- End of Quarter FTE/Workers on site is the number of people employed on IRG projects at the end of that quarter. Over time this figure will fluctuate.

SECTOR DEFINITIONS:

Transport: Transport project are those related to roading, rail, ferries, cycling and cycleways, shared pathways, footpaths and so on.

Housing: Housing projects include the construction and refurbishment of social housing or apartments/units, City Missions, and utilities and land development to enable housing construction.

Community: Examples of community projects include the construction and redevelopment of town centres and community facilities, such as marae, schools, swimming pools, sports centres, libraries, events centres and surf lifesaving clubs.

Services: This category includes the redevelopment of, and improvements to, Police and Fire stations, post office and Defence Force bases and infrastructure that directly supports business and tourism. Also in this category are projects improving access to broadband.

Environment: Environmental projects include flood protection and stormwater management, renewable energy initiatives and projects associated with reducing and mitigating climate change.
